About the Program

The Associate of Science (AS) has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The degree is fully articulated with SOU's Health and Exercise Science (HEX) program and allows students to transfer directly as juniors and to become admitted into the HEX program at SOU with no loss of credits to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of health, PE, and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of Health and Exercise Science.

Students should contact the SOU HEX program early in their first year of the RCC AS program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the SOU program.

Students should be aware if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students may be required to take SOU placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Note: Students who graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) two years of the same high school-level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C-" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). Students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school will be required to complete the equivalent of one year of study of a foreign language at the second-year level (or above) before graduation

Advanced Standing

Coursework from regionally accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with SOU policies. A maximum of 24 "professional/technical" credits are transferrable to SOU and will be counted as elective credit. Students must complete WR 121, WR 122, and the Speech course chosen to meet the SOU Oral Communication requirement with a C or better.

Graduation Requirements

The Associate of Science degree will be awarded by RCC to students who complete all credits in this program with a grade of "C" or better. Some required courses may be graded on a pass/no pass basis. A grade of "P" for these courses indicated a student earned a "C" or better grade

Note: The Bachelor of Science degree requires two courses (7 or more credits) of math, designated programming, statistics, or logic courses. The science courses may be completed at RCC or at SOU.

Humanities 19-12 credits

Three approved courses for the SOU General Education Transfer Guide 9-12 credits

The Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree requires completion of 1 year of the same foreign language at 2nd year level or above, or 4 years of the same foreign language in high school (C- or better), or successful completion of a proficiency exam. Second year foreign language may simultaneously count for Humanities and the BA requirements.

These will serve to satisfy the SOU lower division general education science requirement.
