Associate of Science - Umpqua Community College Articulated with the Criminology and Criminal Justice Program at Southern Oregon University

Academic Year 2022/23 (Effective until revised or terminated by UCC or SOU)

About the Program

The Associate of Science degree (Criminal Justice) has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The degree is fully articulated with SOU's Criminology and Criminal Justice program and allows students to transfer directly as with no loss of credits to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of criminal justice and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of criminology.

Students should contact the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice early in the first year of their AS program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students who complete the AS requirements for UCC and the elective courses that will transfer to meet most of the course requirements for the SOU CCJ program. Students are required to complete CCJ 198 Orientation to Criminology and Criminal Justice after transferring. This course is only offered through SOU.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students who transfer with the AS completed and the SOU General Education complete will not need to take a placement test and will transfer as junior level. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the Criminal Justice Department head's approval. In order to ensure coursework is current, program courses over 10 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements. Students who follow this agreement will have met all of SOU's lower division general education and all but one lower division SOU CCJ program requirement. Students will need to take the SOU course CCJ 198 Orientation to Criminology and Criminal Justice after transferring. This course is only offered at SOU.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 90 term credits of lower division collegiate courses with a minimum grade point of 2.0 and a grade of "C" or better in Writing 121, Writing 122 or Writing 123, and the Speech class chosen to meet the Oral Communication requirement. Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). Note: If students plan to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school, they must have a proficiency in a foreign language regardless of when they graduated from high school or equivalency program.

Note: A Bachelor of Arts degree requires the equivalent of one year of study of a foreign language at the second-year level or above. Students seeking a career in criminal justice at the federal level are encouraged to take at least two years of a foreign language. The second year of foreign language courses can also be used to meet the Humanities requirement.

Social Science 9 credits

The following courses will apply to the SOU Social Science General Education requirement and are required to earn the UCC AS degree. These courses also transfer as lower division required courses in the CCJ major at SOU. One additional Social Science course from the SOU <u>General Education Transfer</u> <u>Guide must be taken</u>.
