

**Klamath Community College Associate of

Articulated to Southern Oregon University  
Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in

Effective Fall Term 2015**

It is agreed that students transferring from Klamath Community College (KCC) in an Associate of Applied Science program to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program will be given full credit for all selected courses listed below. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and technical courses at both KCC and SOU, and will remain in effect until it is updated or terminated by KCC or SOU. This agreement is dated April 9, 2010.


Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded. Upper-division is defined as 300-and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution. Baccalaureate students at SOU must complete 45 credits from SOU before a degree will be awarded. To become admitted to the BAS program, students must hold an AAS degree outside the area of business with a GPA of 2.5 or better.

Transfer students may guarantee their catalog of graduation by obtaining written approval from their SOU major department and the Registrar. The agreed upon catalog will be the one a student uses when he/she transfers to SOU. Students must enroll at SOU within three years of this approval.

**Requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Science in Management Program:**

1. **Complete an Associate of Applied Science program in any field except Business or Accounting with a GPA of 2.5 or better.** Not all AAS degree programs require the same amount of transferable general education coursework. If a student intends to transfer to SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program, SOU's general education courses should be chosen wherever possible in the AAS degree. Approximately 60 credits of Career-Technical coursework will transfer into the BAS program depending on how much general education is completed as part of the AAS program. Students should see their advisors for more information.

1. *SOU accepts a maximum of 124 credits from a community college.* SOU will accept up to 74 technical credits applicable to these program requirements. The actual number of vocational credits accepted may be less than 74 and will depend on the number of credits a student transfers to satisfy general education requirements. SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management degree requires 180 total credits. Students completing both the AAS and BAS degrees may accumulate more than 180 credits.
2. SOU requires three social science classes from an approved list. ECON 201 and ECON 202 are required for the BAS program. The third class recommended is PSY 101 or BA101.
3. SOU requires three humanities classes from an approved list of courses. Students may find this approved list on the General Education Transfer Guide [here](#).
