College of the Siskiyous Associate Degree Programs to

Southern Oregon University Bachelor of Applied Science in Management

Effective Fall Term 2010 (until revised or terminated)

It is agreed that students transferring from College of the Siskiyous (COS) in an Associate degree program to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) Bachelor of Applied Science in Management program will be given full credit for all designated courses listed below. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and technical courses at both COS and SOU, and will remain in effect until it is updated or terminated by COS or SOU.

Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 quarter credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded. Upper-division is defined as 300-and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution. Baccalaureate students at SOU must complete 45 quarter credits from SOU before a degree will be awarded. To become admitted to the BAS program, students must hold an associate degree outside the area of business with a GPA of 2.5 or better.

Transfer students may guarantee their catalog of graduation by obtaining written approval from their SOU major department. The agreed upon catalog will be the one a student uses when he/she transfers to SOU. Students must enroll at SOU within three years of this approval.

Associate of Arts or Science - College of the Siskiyous (COS) Articulated with the Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Management at Southern Oregon University

About the Program

This program has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The program is fully articulated with SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science (BAS) in Management program and allows students to transfer and become admitted into the School of Business at Southern Oregon University to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of career technical coursework, business coursework, and general education courses that support advanced study in Management.

Students should contact a counselor at COS or the SOU School of Business early in the first year of their associate degree program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students should be aware of the admission requirements at SOU, including the minimum GPA requirement of 2.50 in their associate degree program.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing their associate degree, they will not be eligible for the BAS program and their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements and School of Business requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students who have not satisfied the Math and English general education requirements must take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the approval of the Dean of the School of Business. To ensure coursework is current, program course credits over 10 years old may be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 180 quarter credits (120 semester credits) to earn a bachelor's degree at SOU. Students must earn C- or better in Written & Oral Communication General Education courses. For additional degree requirements, visit the SOU School of Business website listed below, and consult with an academic advisor.

Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school-level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C-" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits).

Requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Science in Management Program:

1. Complete an Associate degree in any field except Business or Accounting with a GPA of 2.5 or better. Not all AS degree programs require the same amount of transferable general education coursework. If a student intends to transfer to SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science program, SOU's general education courses should be chosen where possible in the AS degree. Approximately 34-41 semester credits of Career Technical coursework will transfer into the BAS program depending on how much general education is completed as part of the associate degree. 2. Complete the SOU General Education requirements. There are three possible options for College of the Siskiyous students to satisfy General Education Requirements:

- 1. SOU accepts a maximum of 124 credits from a community college. The number of career technical credits applicable to this program will depend upon the number of credits a student transfers to satisfy the general education requirements. SOU's Bachelor of Applied Science in Management degree requires 180 total quarter credits. Students completing both the Associate and BAS degrees may accumulate more than 180 quarter credits.
- 2. The SOUGE pattern requires three social science classes from an approved list. Econ1A and Econ1B are required for the BAS program. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide at www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
- 3. The SOUGE pattern requires three humanities classes from an approved list of courses. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide at www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
- 4. The SOUGE pattern requires three sciences classes from an approved list. Two of those courses must have a lab. Students may find the list of approved courses on the General Education Transfer Guide at www.sou.edu/admissions/transfer and select "General Education Transfer Guides."
- 5. Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 quarter credits of upper-division work before a degree will be awarded. Upper-division is defined as 300- and 400- level classes at a bachelor's degree granting institution.
