It is agreed that students transferring from Linn-Benton Community College (LBCC) to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) Bachelor of Science degree in Early Childhood Development will be given full credit for all courses required for the AAS in Child & Family Studies. Students following this program of study will have met SOU's lower-division general education requirements and the prerequisite course requirements for the major. They will be assured junior standing within the academic major, and will be eligible for admission to the Early Childhood Development major. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and pre-requisite courses at both Linn-Benton and SOU and will remain in effect until updated or terminated by LBCC or SOU.

Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper division work before a degree will be awarded and meet all the requirements of SOU prior to graduation. Upper division is defined as 300- and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree-granting institution.

Transfer students may guarantee their catalog of graduation by obtaining written approval from their SOU major department. The agreed upon catalog will be the one a student uses when he/she declares the Child & Family Studies degree major at Linn-Benton. Students must enroll at SOU within two years of this approval or petition the School of Education after a two year lapse.

About the Program

The Associate of Applied Science in Child and Family Studies (C&FS) degree has been reviewed by faculty within LBCC and SOU. The AAS degree combined with the general education courses outlined below is fully articulated with SOU's Early Childhood Development program and allows students to transfer directly as juniors and to become admitted into the Early Childhood Development program at SOU with no loss of credits to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of early childhood and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of early childhood development.

Students should contact the SOU School of Education early in the beginning of their AAS in Child and Family Studies program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements at LBCC

Students are required to take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the approval of the Chair in the School of Education. In order to ensure coursework is current, program courses over 10 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

Graduation Requirements

The Associate of Applied Science in Child and Family Studies degree will be awarded to students who complete all credits in this program with a grade of "C" or better. Certain required courses are graded on a pass/no pass basis only. A grade of "P" for these courses indicates a student earned a "C" or better grade.

Note: Students who graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) two years of the same high school-level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C-" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). Students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school will be required to complete the equivalent of one year of study of a foreign language at the second-year level (or above) before graduation.

- 2. Satisfy all of the General Education Requirements described below. The AAS degree satisfies some General Education requirements. The remaining credits should be chosen to complete the requirements described below. Work closely with your academic advisor to plan your course schedule.
