

Associate of Applied Science in Education at Klamath Community College

Articulated with the BA or BS in Elementary Education at Southern Oregon University

It is agreed that students transferring from Klamath Community College (KCC) to Southern Oregon University's (SOU) BA or BS degree in Elementary Education will be given full credit for all selected courses listed on the attached schedule. Students following this program of study will have met SOU's lower-division general education requirements, will be assured junior standing within the academic major, and will be eligible for admission to the Education program. This agreement is based on the evaluation of the rigor and content of the general education and technical courses at both KCC and SOU and is subject to a yearly re-evaluation by both schools for continuance.

Baccalaureate students must complete a minimum of 60 credits of upper division work and meet all the requirements of SOU prior to graduation. Upper division is defined as 300- and 400-level classes at a bachelor's degree-granting institution.



Associate of Applied Science in Education - Klamath Community College Articulated with the Bachelor of Arts or Science in Elementary Education Program at Southern Oregon University

About the Program

The Associate of Applied Science degree in Education has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The degree is fully articulated with SOU's Elementary Education program and allows students to transfer directly as juniors and to become admitted into the Education program at Southern Oregon University with no loss of credits to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of Elementary Education and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of education.

Students should contact the SOU School of Education early in the first year of their Associate of Applied Science in Education program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school and program. The program enables students to complete all required fieldwork within Klamath Falls and academic coursework completed in three formats: face-to-face within Klamath Falls, online, and in hybrid format (online plus one Saturday per month at SOU). The Elementary Education program includes an option to apply to a "licensure track" which enables students to complete both the BA/BS degree and qualify for an Oregon teaching license.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing the Associate of Applied Science in Education degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students are required to take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirements for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school-level second language with a grade of "C-" or better in all semesters, or 2) two terms of the same college-level second language with a grade of "C-" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). Note: If students plan to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school, they need to complete one year of foreign language at the second year college level or above with grade of "C-" or better regardless of when they graduate from high school or equivalency program.

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the approval of the Chair of Undergraduate Education Programs. In order to ensure coursework is current, program course credits over 10 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

Graduation Requirements

Students must:

1. Complete the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Education at KCC (90 credits) followed by 90 credits through SOU (180 credits total).
2. Complete a minimum of 90 term credits of lower division collegiate courses with a minimum grade of C- or better.
3. Satisfy all of the General Education Requirements described below. The 90-credit Associate in Applied Science Degree in Education satisfies some General Education requirements. The remaining general education credits should be chosen to complete the requirements described below. Work closely with your academic advisor to plan your course schedule.

Writing and Oral Communication Skills - Minimum Credits: 12

WRI 121: English Composition I

WRI 122: English Composition II or WRI 227: Technical Writing

SPE 111: Fundamentals of Speech or SPE 215: Small Group Communication

Mathematics (General Education - Quantitative Reasoning) - Minimum Credits: 12

Math 211: Foundations of Elementary Math I

Math 212: Foundations of Elementary Math II

Math 213: Foundations of Elementary Math III

Note: MTH 211 and 212 satisfy the SOU Quantitative Reasoning requirement. MTH 213 is also required for admission to the Elementary Education Program

Humanities Exploration - Minimum Credits: 12

Complete at least three Humanities courses from the University Studies Transfer Guide*

Note: Must complete one course in English or Literature, one course in Art History or Music History, and one additional Humanities course.

Social Science Exploration - Minimum Credits: 12

HPE 295 Health and Fitness for Life

Complete at least two other Social Science courses from the University Studies Transfer Guide*

Note: Must complete one course in United States History or World History and one course in Human Geography.

Science Exploration - Minimum Credits: 11

Complete at least three Science courses from the University Studies Transfer Guide*

Note: Must complete one course in Life Science, one course in Physical Science, and one additional Science course. At least two courses must have labs.

Program specific requirements

Complete one of the following:

EDU 200: Introduction to Education, EDU 216: Practicum Seminar, or EDU 232 Educational Psychology

Complete at least two credits of EDU 209: Practicum

Note: Practicum experiences must include at least one 30 hour experience in preschool and one 30 hour experience in primary or upper elementary.

Additional courses that may be taken at KCC to satisfy program requirements

EDU 251: Overview of the Exceptional Learner

MU 265: Music for Teachers

ART 265: Art for Teachers
