About the Program

The Associate of Science has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The degree is fully articulated with SOU's Education Studies program and allows students to transfer directly as juniors and to become admitted into the Education Studies program at Southern Oregon University with no loss of credits to pursue a bachelor's degree. Students should contact the SOU program early in the first year of their AS program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU

Entry Requirements

Students are required to take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirements for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school-level second language with a grade of "C-" or better in all semesters, or 2) two terms of the same college-level second language with a grade of "C-" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). Note: If students plan to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school, they need to complete one year of foreign language at the second-year college level or above with grade of "C-" or better regardless of when they graduated from high school or equivalency program.

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies in order to ensure coursework is current, program courses over 7 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department chair before being accepted toward course requirements

Graduation Requirements

The Associate of Science degree will be awarded to students who complete all credits in this program with a grade of "C" or better. Some required courses may be graded on a pass/no pass basis. A grade of "P" for these courses indicates a student earned a "C" or better grade.

Choose one of the following ways to complete SOUs lower division general education requirements.

- 1. Complete the requirements for the Oregon Transfer Module (OTM) at RCC.
- 2. Complete the AAOT or ASOT requirements at RCC.
- 3. Work closely with an academic advisor to complete courses at RCC that will meet the SOU lower division Capacity requirements.

A guide to help meet the SOU lower division Capacity requirements with RCC transfer courses

To meet the Purposeful Learning Capacity component of the SOU lower division general education take the following courses:

WRI 121Z Composition I

WRI 122Z Composition II

and choose one of the following COMM courses:

COMM 111Z Public Speaking or COMM 218Z Interpersonal Communication or COMM 225 Small Group Communication and Problem Solving

The three courses transferred together will transfer to meet the Purposeful Learning requirement.

The other lower division Capacities are met by 1 course each at 3-5 credits. Each Capacity must be met by an approved course. Subject codes can only be used one time per Capacity. The subject code is the one assigned by SOU after the course transfer. See the General Education Transfer Tools to choose your courses. It is very important to work closely with an academic advisor to ensure the courses you choose help you meet SOU and RCC requirements. COMM and WR are subject codes that can be repeated one time to meet a Capacity outside of Purposeful Learning. Since WR and COMM are required for Purposeful Learning to be met by transfer courses, the subject codes WR and COMM can be used once more to satisfy one of the other Capacities. For example, if a WR course is found to transfer as an SOU WR course that can meet the Communication and Expression Capacity at SOU it can be used to meet this Capacity. But that will be the last time the WR subject code can be used to meet a Capacity

Communication & Expression (LDCE) 4 credits

Any one of these courses will satisfy the LDCE Capacity and will meet the Humanities requirement for the RCC AS degree.

Take 1 course at 3-4 credits that is approved for LDIA from the <u>SOU General Education Transfer</u> Guide.

Numerical Literacy (LDNL) 4-8 credits

The following math courses are required for the BS/BA degree and highly recommended for transfer. Please see your academic advisor for details.

Note: MTH 211 and MTH 212 both need to be taken to meet SOU's GE requirement.
