About the Program

The Associate of Science degree at RCC has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The degree is fully articulated with SOU's Emerging Media and Digital Arts (EMDA) program and allows students to transfer directly as juniors and to become admitted into the EMDA program at Southern Oregon University with no loss of credits to pursue a bachelor's degree. The program offers an excellent balance of EMDA and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of EMDA. Students should contact the EMDA program early in the first year of their AS program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students are required to take the college placement test to determine skill level and readiness indicated by test scores. As part of their training program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by placement test scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success. Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school- level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits).

Advanced Standing

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the EMDA program's approval. To ensure coursework is current, program courses over5 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 90 term credits of lower division collegiate courses with a minimum grade point of 2.0 and a grade of "C" or better in WR121Z, WR 122Z and WR 227 Technical Writing or one of the approved COMM (111Z, 218Z, or 225) classes chosen to meet the SOU GE Capacity Purposeful Learning.

If students plan to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school, they must have a proficiency in a foreign language regardless of when they graduated from high school or equivalency program.

Choose one of the following ways to complete SOU's lower division general education Capacity requirements.

- 1. Complete the requirements for the Oregon Transfer Module at RCC.
- 2. Complete the AAOT or ASOT requirements at RCC.

3. Work closely with an academic advisor to complete courses at RCC that will meet the SOU lower division general education Capacity requirements.

The subject code is the one assigned once the course transfers to SOU regardless what subject code was assigned at RCC. Work closely with your advisor to find the courses that best fit your path.

Take 1 course at 3-4 credits that is approved for LDCI from the SOU General Education Transfer Guide.

Take 1 course at 3-4 credits that is approved for LDIA from the SOU General Education Transfer Guide.

Numerical Literacy 1 course 3-4 credits

Take 1 course at 3-4 credits that is approved for LDNL from the <u>SOU General Education Transfer Guide</u>. MTH 105 is recommended

Equity Diversity and Inclusion 1 course 3-4 credits

Take 1 course at 3-4 credits that is approved for LDDI from the <u>SOU General Education Transfer Guide</u>.
