FALL TERM HIGHLIGHTS

- Nearly all classes taught hybrid or remote. Few in-person courses (e.g. labs, music, etc.)
- Lower density and room capacity for classrooms, labs, workplaces, and events will continue
- Thanksgiving Pivot
 - On Nov. 25, all fall courses will transition to distance learning; students will not be required to return to the classroom
- Student Fee Reduction
 - o 10% reduction

PUBLIC HEALTH Face Coverings

Community Respect and Concern

- All staff, faculty, and students are required to use face coverings in enclosed public or common areas; use with physical distancing measures
- Face coverings (cloth, shield, nonmedical grade masks) will be provided to employees and students
- Checklists and educational messaging provided to students prior to fall return

PUBLIC HEALTH COVID Testing

COVID-19 test not required

- The CDC and Jackson County Public Health, do not recommend universal testing of students
- Universal testing has not shown to improve any additional reduction of transmission beyond what prevention measures (e.g. social distancing, face coverings, hand washing and enhanced cleaning) provide
- Students will be required to complete a daily health screening

PUBLIC HEALTH In case of positive case on campus

- Student Health & Wellness Center (SHWC) will work with Jackson County Public Health.
- Student placed in isolation for 10 days and for an additional 24 hours after symptoms resolve.
- If in **residence halls**, student to isolate in room or in building reserved for positive cases. Food will be delivered.
- If living off campus, SHWC is main contact will provide resources daily.

PUBLIC HEALTH Student Health and Wellness Center

OPEN for remote & in-person visits for health and mental health by Sept. 21

- Physical distance adjustments to accommodate sick and well visits
- All students who come to SHWC will be screened, including temperature check
- Telehealth and Tele-mental health options
- Daily Health Screening

PUBLIC HEALTH Campus Facilities

- Limited campus access for nonessential visitors, volunteers, and/or activities involving external groups
- Following CDC guidelines, SOU will increase the cleaning and disinfecting of high traffic and high touch areas
- Installation of plexiglass barriers for all public/student facing interactions
