

OLLI at SOU Shared Interest Groups (SIG)

What is a Shared Interest Group?

A Shared Interest Group, or a SIG, is a group of OLLI members who form around a common interest, activity or topic. OLLI at SOU SIGs are independent and self-managed. SIG members decide when, where, and how often they will meet. Every member of a SIG must be a current OLLI at SOU member.

A SIG may be an off shoot of an OLLI class by students eager to continue pursuing the topic, or an initiative by a member with an idea for an ongoing group endeavor. SIGs can be activity based, discussion based, or simply social gatherings of members.

The SIG is facilitated by one or more of the members in it. The facilitator is responsible for administrative and communication details.
