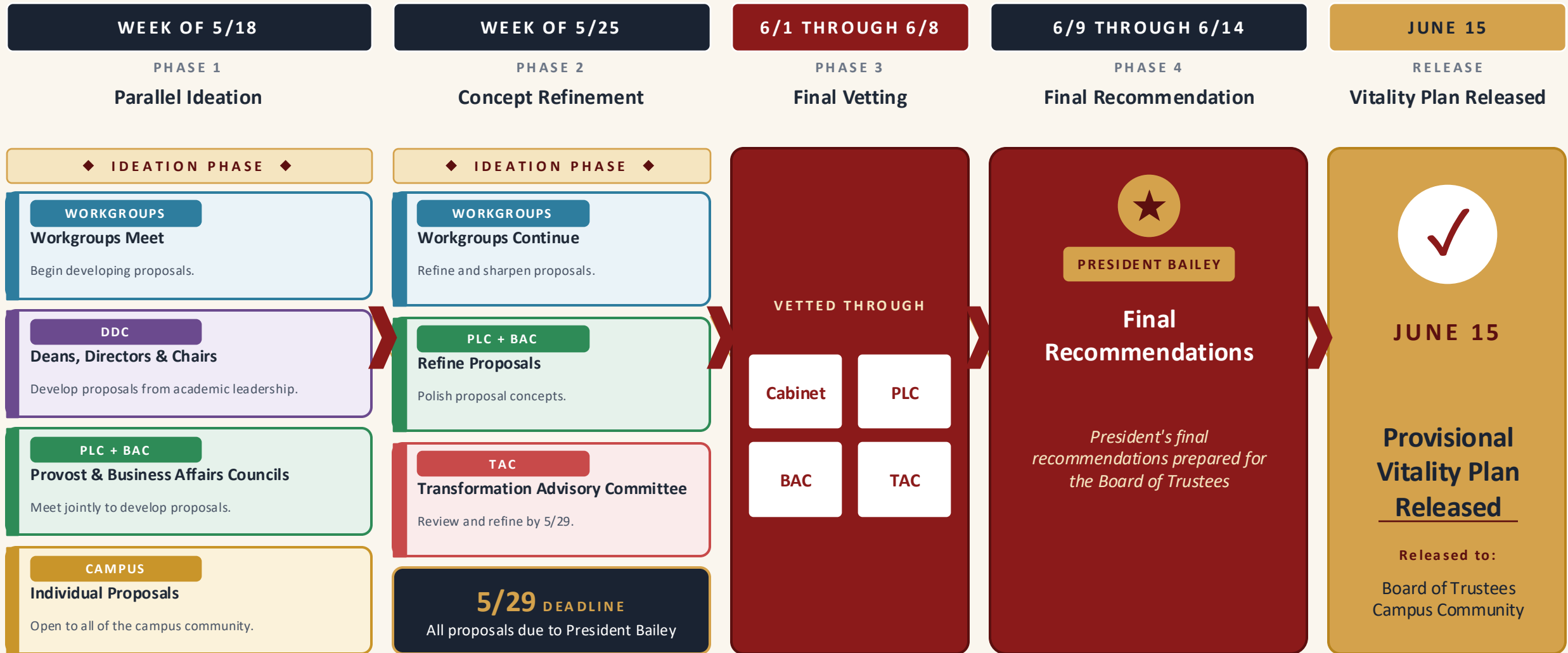

How the Process Works

WHO IS INVOLVED

	Workgroups	Topic-based workgroups developing proposals across focus areas.
	DDC	Deans, Directors & Chairs — academic leadership perspective.
	PLC	Provost Leadership Council.
	BAC	Business Affairs Council.
	Campus Community	Individual proposals welcomed from all faculty, staff, and students.
	TAC	Transformation Advisory Committee — reviews & refines proposals.
	Cabinet	President's Cabinet — vets the final draft.
	President Bailey	Makes final recommendations to the Board of Trustees for the Provisional Vitality Plan.

KEY PRINCIPLES

- 1 Parallel ideation**

Multiple groups develop proposals simultaneously — not sequentially. Workgroups, DDC, PLC, BAC, and the campus community all contribute in parallel.
- 2 Ideation, not decisions**

Every proposal generated between 5/18 and 5/29 is an ideation input. No group's work constitutes a final decision.
- 3 Broad campus input**

Individual proposals are accepted from across the entire campus community alongside the formal workgroups.
- 4 President makes final recommendation to Board**

The President evaluates proposals against a defined set of criteria and makes the final Provisional Vitality Plan recommendations for Board consideration and action.
