Academic Robes and Regalia

The history of academic dress dates back to the Middle Ages when many of the scholars were also clerics and wore the robes of their monastic orders. In 1321, the University of Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations for its faculties. American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code of academic dress. At a conference held at Columbia University in 1895, representatives from various institutions adopted a code and regulations governing academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council on Education.

The regalia worn today are traditional, and their colors, trimmings, and patterns represent the degree, the field of learning, and the institution which conferred that degree. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves and designed to be worn closed; the master's gown has an oblong sleeve open at the wrist. The rear part of the oblong shape is square cut, and the front part has an arc cut away. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, is faced with velvet, and has three bars across the sleeves. The color of the velvet is distinctive to the degree.

The hood also tells a story. The type of degree (Bachelor's, Master's, Doctor's) is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the doctor's hood being the longest and of a fuller shape than the others. The color of the velvet edging indicates the field of learning, and the colors of the lining designate the school which conferred the degree. The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, also indicates the field of study and is gold for those with doctor's degrees.

The colors you will see today in the hoods and gowns of our faculty represent the various fields of learning:

Music: Pink

Business Administration: Drab

Nursing: Apricot

Education: Light Blue

Science: Gold

Fine Arts: Brown

Honorary Degree Awardee Sidney B. DeBoer

Sidney B. DeBoer—a lifelong Rogue Valley resident, community member, entrepreneur, civic leader, philanthropist and supporter of Southern Oregon University—is the newest recipient of one of SOU’s rarest and most prestigious awards: an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters.

Though he was born in Eugene, Sid grew up in Ashland working in the small, community-oriented automotive dealership that his father, Walt, opened on the plaza in 1946. Sid graduated from Ashland High School in 1961 and attended Stanford University on a full scholarship. He returned to Ashland during his sophomore year in 1963 to work for his father. He later studied accounting and business at the University of Oregon before returning to Ashland in 1964 to work full time at the dealership.

Walt DeBoer was struck and killed by a car in 1968, and that accident was a pivotal moment in the evolution of Lithia Motors. Sid gathered enough money to purchase the dealership in Ashland from his mother and moved the store to Medford to retain the Chrysler and Dodge franchise.

The company had grown to six southern Oregon dealerships by 1996, when Sid made a move that would change the history of the automotive industry. He took Lithia Motors public, generating the resources needed to grow regionally and nationally. Lithia continued to buy other dealerships and auto groups, and is now the largest new-vehicle automotive retailer in the United States. At present, Lithia has 482 locations in three countries, 51 brands, and more than 28,000 employees.

Sid’s son Bryan DeBoer ’89 became CEO, and Sid continued to serve as chair of the company’s board of directors. Lithia’s current workforce includes four generations of DeBoer family members, all working to ensure the family’s ongoing involvement in the company and in the communities Lithia serves.

The Oregon Historical Society honored Sid as an “Oregon History Maker” in 2022 for his role in positively shaping the history, culture and landscape of Oregon. This award, and many others, recognize the impact that Sid and Lithia have had in the automotive industry. His gracious friendship and record of accomplishment have led the SOU Board of Trustees to bestow upon Sid an award reserved for those whose exceptional contributions are seldom equaled—the honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters degree from Southern Oregon University.

Throughout his tenure at SOU, Emilio actively engaged in research, teaching, and leadership roles, culminating in the prestigious 2024 Outstanding Research in Psychology Award. Furthermore, he has made substantial contributions to two nonprofit organizations in the Rogue Valley, focusing on at-risk youth aged 9 to 21. Emilio firmly believes that his background in foster care, his identity as a deaf individual, and his involvement in the transgender community should never be concealed, but rather embraced as integral strengths.

Looking ahead, Emilio is poised to embark on the next phase of his academic journey at Oregon State University, pursuing a Master's in Counseling with a specialization in clinical mental health. Emilio extends his heartfelt gratitude to his esteemed academic mentors, Dr. John Taylor and Dr. Emily Reeder, for their invaluable guidance. He also expresses appreciation to the entire psychology department for their continuous inspiration and unwavering support in nurturing his intellectual curiosity.

Last but certainly not least, Emilio wishes to convey his deepest gratitude to his cherished family and friends, who have steadfastly stood by his side throughout the arduous path of higher education, demonstrating unwavering love and support.

EDWARD MINASIAN '24

Edward Minasian is graduating Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English and a Certificate in Literary Studies. Over the course of his college experience, Edward has made his Armenian heritage and ability to speak Russian a point of personal pride, and the topic of much of his research and scholarships. Looking ahead, Mimi is excited to fulfill her long-cherished dream as she joins the organization Docker as a remote software engineer. Her journey thus far has been profoundly enriched by the unwavering love and support of her family, for which she is deeply grateful.

Dankook Award for Outstanding Undergraduate Students

The Dankook Award commemorates more than thirty years of friendship with Dankook University in Seoul, Korea. Each year at commencement, SOU honors two outstanding graduating undergraduate students with this award. This friendship is also recognized during the graduation ceremony at Dankook University, when two of their outstanding graduating undergraduates are presented with the Southern Oregon University Award.

The following criteria are used to select the Dankook Award recipients: (1) demonstration of scholarship as evidenced by cumulative GPA at Southern Oregon University; (2) contributions to campus life by playing a leadership role; and (3) evidence of citizenship and character.

CHRISTOPHER SANTOS '24

Chris Santos is a Honors College student graduating Summa Cum Laude with a degree in Psychology. Not only is Chris an outstanding student academically, he is also very active across campus. Chris has served for two years as a teaching assistant for two faculty members in the Psychology department. Chris is also involved with a research lab in the Psychology program, and recently presented a poster at a national APA conference. In addition, Chris has worked on campus at the Stevenson Union for a number of years and serves as an SOU Ambassador.

TIMOTHY TURNER '24

Tim Turner is graduating with the highest honors, Summa Cum Laude, with a degree in Theatre Arts. Throughout his time at SOU, Tim has been an outstanding student and artist. He is a highly respected member of his cohort in the BFA acting sequence and is beloved by his peers. Tim has been very involved in the artistic community at SOU and in Ashland. The award winner represents the highest level of academic achievement and service.

CASSIE PRESKENIS '24

Cassie Preskenis is among the first three students to graduate from SOU with both a Bachelor's degree and a Masters in Business Administration. Alongside her exceptional academic achievements, Cassie has dedicated herself to serving the local community, bringing the same level of commitment as she did to her work at SOU. She has focused on fostering connections between the SOU campus and the broader community over the past three years.

Cassie has played a pivotal role as a Graduate Assistant in the School of Business, contributing to the student experience. She has also held key positions for various events and committees. Notably, she played a vital role in organizing the Creativity Conference and the Business Venture Tournament. Additionally, Cassie served on the Marketing Committee for the School of Science and Business. Beyond her university involvement, Cassie has generously volunteered her time and expertise to engage students in community art projects and has actively participated in events like Indigenous People's Day. She also serves on a committee that is assessing the feasibility of establishing a youth center in Ashland.

Cassie's recent community endeavors include playing a foundational role in the Say Their Names Coalition and serving as the organizer for Ashland's inaugural Juneteenth Celebration. Her dedication to both the community and SOU exemplifies the spirit of the University of Guanajuato Award.

Distinguished Scholarship

Dr. Terry Longshore

Dr. Longshore has demonstrated on-going excellence in scholarship since arriving at SOU in 2000. He has exemplified on-going commitment to scholarship, long after being awarded the rank of full Professor. Dr. Longshore is distinctive for his role in the creation of a legacy of new works for percussion. Dr. Longshore's leadership of a commission consortium means that he is recognized internationally as an active participant in the creation of new works for percussion. Dr. Longshore has achieved numerous academic honors as a published composer and recording artist including recognition as an education artist from notable companies like; Yamaha Percussion, Remo Drumheads, Vic Firth Sticks & Mallets, and Zildjian Cymbals. Dr. Longshore recently traveled to Louisville, Kentucky for workshop rehearsals of Teddy Abrams' Mammoth. The piece premiered in April 2023 in Mammoth Cave National Park, performed by Yo-Yo Ma and the Louisville Orchestra. Southern Oregon University is fortunate to have a professor of Dr. Longshore's caliber. He is a role model and mentor to us all and is well-deserving of the Distinguished Scholarship Award.

Dr. Sean McEnroe

Dr. McEnroe, Professor of History, is an established and highly respected historian of Latin America. He has numerous chapters and articles, and published two major books. As a life-long "student of history," Dr. McEnroe welcomes opportunities to learn and stretch his areas of expertise, and this is on full display with his recent projects, which include an international collaborative effort studying the Mexican American War from a historical, archaeological, and cultural point of view as well as a study of the use of spiritualism in 19th century Mexican elites. Dr. McEnroe's dedication to scholarly work, his exemplary publication record, and his leadership and collegiality in collaborative projects qualify him as a worth recipient of the Distinguished Scholarship award.

Distinguished Service

Jackie Apodaca

Jackie Apodaca is a Professor of Theatre and since her start at SOU, Jackie has worked tirelessly to make SOU a better working and teaching environment for her fellow faculty members and provide her students with an abundance of opportunities and experiences. Currently serving as co-chair of the Theatre Department while taking on the highly-visible shared-governance leadership role of Faculty Senate Chair, Jackie also chaired the Provost's Workload Workgroup in 2023. Jackie shines in the community as Artistic Director of Ashland New Plays Festival, regional Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival (Region 7), and regional coordinator of the ASPIRE leadership program. She has

continually advocated for the placement of SOU theatre students in positions at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, helping rebuild these connections in the aftermath of the pandemic.

Dr. Rachel Jochem

Dr. Jochem has served her department diligently as a Super Advisor (taking on 80-90 advisees), regularly takes new faculty under her wings and was chair of the department. As Co-Chair of the University Planning Committee, she helped promote better water use, carbon neutral practices and nominated SOU to be the first Bee Campus in the nation. As a member of the SOU Planning Board, she helped codify SOU's strategic plan related to Diversity and Inclusion. She has contributed to curriculum development as part of the Gen Ed task force and promoted high school student learning through the Advanced Southern Credit program. She has given very valuable service to the faculty body as the Faculty Ombudsman, Senate Advisory Council member, Faculty Senator, Faculty Workload Working Group member and APSOU President and was part of the team negotiating contracts.

Distinguished Teaching

Dr. Jessica Piekielek

Dr. Jessica Piekielek is a campus leader in community-based learning, inviting her students to engage with important global questions through local conditions. These community-based project assignments clearly demonstrate how having a publicly facing project audience makes for a more authentic student learning experience fostering skills in communication and civic engagement. She also excels at incorporating other high impact teaching practices such as writing-intensive courses, undergraduate research, and collaborative assignments to provide her students with superb training in the discipline and an overall experience understanding the ethics, research, and studies of communities of other cultures.

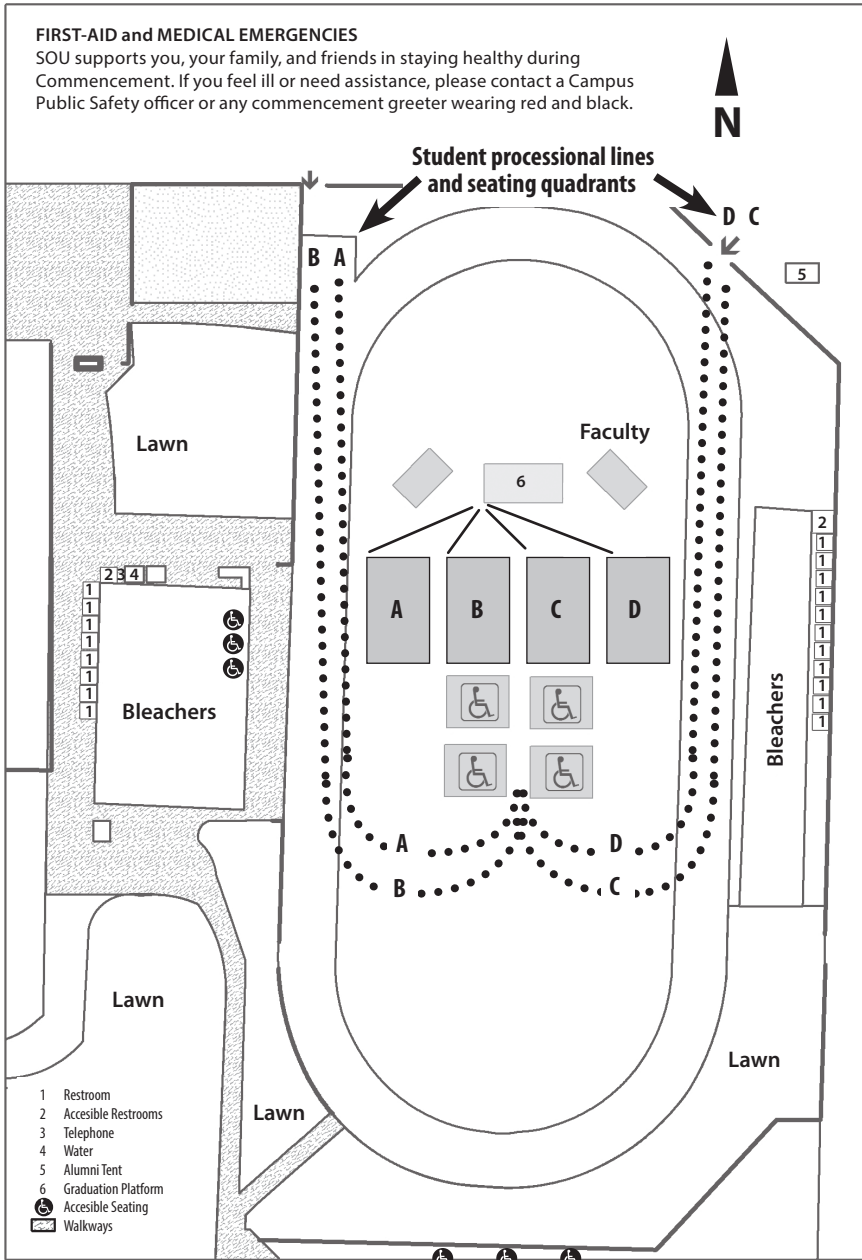
Dr. Kristin Hocevar
