Guidelines for listing prerequisites

In order to standardize and increase the accuracy and consistency of the catalog entry process for prerequisites, a "prerequisite table" has been created in the "New Course Proposal" form. Here's how to enter a course's prerequisites:

- a. *Single and multiple prerequisites.* When there is a single prerequisite it should be entered on the top line. When there are multiple prerequisites e.g., COMM 200 *and* 201 they should be entered, one each, on descending lines, as shown in Sample #1.
- b. Alternative prerequisites. When there are alternative prerequisites COMM 201 or BA 324 or PSY 322, etc the prerequisites should be entered on a single line, as show in Sample #2.
- c. *Required and alternative prerequisites*. When there are both multiple required *and* alternative prerequisites, enter the multiple prerequisites first, one on each line, and then the alternative prerequisites, together, on a single line as shown in Sample #3.
- d. *Recommended courses* We are no longer posting "recommended courses" in the catalog.
